THE ANIMAL HEALTH ACT

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Act to amend the Stock Diseases Act

ENACTED by the Parliament of Zambia

Enactment

This Act may be cited as the Animal Health (Amendment) Act, 1996, and shall be read as one with the Stock Diseases Act, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act

Short Title

Section 1 to be amended to read: ANIMAL HEALTH ACT

Section 2 to be expanded and to read:

Interpretation

“animal” means any mammal, other than human, bird, fish, reptile, amphibian which is a member of the Phylum vertebrates, including the carcass of such animal;

“animal product” means meat, meat product, any product of animal origin for human consumption, for use in animal feeding or for pharmaceutical or agricultural use;

“authorised officer” means the Director, any Veterinary Officer or local veterinary inspector;

“border inspection post” means a veterinary inspection post near the border and the point of entry designated by the Minister by a statutory instrument.

“controlled veterinary action” in relation to any animal means

- (a) the isolation, detention, inspection, testing, immunisation, observation, sampling, marking, treatment, care, destruction or any other disposal thereof;
- (b) the carrying out of any post mortem examination on any animal.

“conveyance” means any aircraft, ship, boat, train, motor, car, van, truck, cart, or other conveyance of whatever kind, including the fittings and equipment and, in the case of animals, the harness and tackle thereof;

“department” means the Department of Animal Production and Health;

“departmental officer” means any veterinary officer, livestock officer or veterinary assistant employed by the Government;

“Director” when the incumbent is a registered veterinary surgeon means the Deputy Director of Research and Specialist Services and includes Principal Veterinary Officers, one of which shall be a registered veterinary surgeon;

“dog” other than in regulations dealing only with registration, includes any tame or partly tame carnivorous animal in captivity.

“honorary stock inspector” means any person authorised to exercise or perform any power, or duty or requested to render any service by the Director;

“local veterinary inspector” means a Registered veterinary surgeon appointed by the Minister to undertake designated official duties on behalf of the department for a specified period and location determined by the Director;

“notifiable disease” means any animal disease which is listed in the Sixth Schedule A or any other disease which fulfils one of the following conditions and which the Minister may, by statutory instrument declare -

- (i) which is not indigenous or native to Zambia; or
- (ii) which spreads rapidly with serious socio-economic consequences; or
- (iii) which is of major importance in the international trade of animals or animal products; or
- (iv) which is common to human beings and animals [Zoonosis]; or
- (v) for which any general or particular control measures have been prescribed.

“outbreak of disease” means an occurrence of one of the notifiable diseases or any other disease which the Minister may, by statutory instrument declare in:

- (a) any agricultural establishment, breeding establishment or premises including all buildings and all adjoining premises where animals are present; or
- (b) any specified area by the Minister or authorised officer in any communally grazed animals.

“owner”

- (a) in relation to any animal, includes the person for the time being having the management, custody or control of such animals;
- (b) when used to any land or place, the registered owner when he is in actual occupation of such land the expression when so used means any person who, whether lessee or licensee, or otherwise entitled has for the time being the charge, control and management or occupation of such land or place.

“prescribe” means prescribe by regulation;

“quarantine station” means any quarantine station established under this Act;

“regulation” means any regulation made under this Act;

“this Act” includes any regulations and control measures;

“veterinary officer” means any officer in the service of the Government who is a registered veterinary surgeon;

“veterinary surgeon” means a person whose name appears in the Register as a Veterinary Surgeon.

4. Section 3 (1) to be amended to read:

Every owner, person in control or any animal suspected of being affected by any animal disease and every registered veterinary

Notice of disease or suspected disease to be given

surgeon or registered livestock assistant shall:

- (a) as far as practicable, keep such animals separated from other animals not affected;
- (b) immediately, give notice of the animal so affected or suspected of being so affected to the nearest departmental officer, police officer, agricultural officer, District Executive officer, chief, village headman or owner of land.

Section 3 (2) and (3) to be amended to read:

- (2) Every person other than a departmental officer, so notified, shall forthwith, notify the nearest departmental officer or local veterinary inspector;
- (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (i), any local veterinary inspector who has reason to believe that any animal is suffering from a disease shall forthwith give notice of that fact to the authorised officer.

5. Section 4 (1) to be amended to read:

- (1) Whenever at any place, whether within or outside Zambia there exists, or is suspected to exist, any disease which is likely to affect animals, the Minister or an authorised officer may make such order as he thinks fit for all or any of the following purposes:
 - (a) for prohibiting or regulating the introduction of any animal, embryos, ova or semen, carcass, article or vehicle from such place into Zambia or any portion of Zambia.
 - (b) for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, carcasses, articles or vehicles within or out of any part of Zambia named in order;
 - (c) for regulating the quarantine, isolation, disinfection, disinsectisation, or treatment of animals, carcasses, articles or vehicles in any part of Zambia named in the order;
 - (d) for prohibiting or regulating the sale of animals, carcasses, or articles or vehicles and control of agricultural show grounds, stock markets or sales-yards in any part named in the order.
- (2) Any person who fails to comply with subsection(1)(a), (1)(b), (1)(c) or (1)(d) shall be guilty of an offense.

Power to control introduction and quarantine of animals etc.

6. Section 5(c) to be added to read:

- (c) Whenever any animals have been found straying into Zambia from outside or straying within, into, or out of any specified area in Zambia;

the Minister or an authorised officer may make such order as he thinks fit for all or any of the following purposes:

Power to order seizure of animals

- (i) for directing that such animals, carcass, article or vehicle be seized and detained;
 - (ii) for directing that such animals, carcass, articles or vehicles be dealt with in such manner as is deemed necessary to prevent the spread of disease.
7. Section 8(1) to be amended to read: Power of entry
- (1) An authorised officer may enter on any land, farm or ranch or into any stable, pen, sty or outbuilding or any kraal, enclosure or vehicle and may take with him such persons, animals and things as he may deem necessary for the purpose of inspecting, examining or collecting samples from any animals, carcass, article or vehicle or doing or causing to be done or supervising and inspecting the doing of anything which is required to be done under this Act or under any order made under the provisions of this Act.
8. Section 9 (1) to be amended to read: Power to order collection of animals
- (1) A departmental officer may instruct the owner of any animals to assemble the animals or any part of the animals at any specified place for the purposes of inspection or inoculation or for any purpose authorised under the provisions of this Act or under any order made under the provision of this Act.
9. Section 10 (1) and (2) and Section 11 to be combined to read: Person in control of animals in transit and records to be kept by carriers
10. (1) Animals in transit by train within Zambia or through Zambia shall be under the control of such person as the railway company conveying the animals shall appoint, and in default of such appointment the guard of the train conveying such animals shall be deemed to be the person in control of such animals.
- (2) Animals in transit by any road vehicle within or through Zambia shall be under the control of such person as the transporter shall appoint, and in default of such appointment, the driver of the vehicle shall be deemed to be the person in control of such animals.
- (3) Animals in transit by road vehicle through Zambia shall be transported in sealed vehicles
- (4) A railway company conveying animals by rail and the owner of any vehicle which at any time convey animals for hire, or reward, shall maintain a record of such animals conveyed, showing:-
- (a) the dates on which such animals were conveyed;
 - (b) the types and individual marks of each individual animal; as the Minister may prescribe by statutory instrument; and

- (c) the full names and address of the consignors and consignee of such animals; and
 - (d) shall maintain and make such record available, and at the request of, a departmental officer or local veterinary inspector for a period of six months after the due date of conveyance.
10. Section 12 (1) (2) to be amended by the addition of departmental officer and honorary stock inspector respectively. Indemnity
11. Section 13(1) to be amended to read: Compensation
- (1) No compensation shall be payable in respect of any animal slaughtered for the purpose of the control of notifiable disease except:-
 - (a) in the case of an animal which, when slaughtered, is found not to be infected or likely to spread infection of any disease; and
 - (b) when animals which may be infected with disease at the time of notification are subsequently slaughtered in order to prevent further spread of such disease.
 - (2) Funds for compensation in 13 (1) shall be appropriated by the Parliament.
13. New Section to be added Limitations on investigations, experiments and research with, and manufacture and evaluation of certain products
- 13A (1) No person shall, except under a permit and in compliance with the conditions which are determined by the Director:
- (a) conduct any investigation or research with any vaccine, serum, toxin anti-toxin, antigen or other biological products which consists or originates wholly or partially of, or from any micro-organism or of, or from glands organs, fluids or any part any animal:
- Provided that the foregoing of this paragraph shall not apply to any substances controlled under the Pharmacy, Medicines and Poisons Act.
- (b) for the manufacture or evaluation of any product used for or intended to be used at or for the testing, diagnosis, prevention and treatment or care of any animal disease.
 - (c) for the purpose of any investigation, experiment or research referred to in (a) above or for the manufacture or evaluation of a product referred to in (b) above:
 - (i) infect or contaminate any other thing with any notifiable animal disease; or
 - (ii) introduce into or collect in Zambia or have in his possession, or remove or transport from any controlled animal or article, any protozoan, bacterium, virus, fungus, parasite, other organism or agent which is capable of spreading any notifiable animal disease.

Section 13C	(1)	The Minister shall by notice in the Gazette establish an Emergency animal disease control Interdisciplinary Committee in respect of any serious notifiable disease outbreak.	Establishment of Emergency animal disease control Interdisciplinary Committee
	(a)	the Committee shall comprise of the Permanent Secretary of MAFF as Chairman and the Permanent Secretaries of the Ministries of Home Affairs, Transport and Communications, Health and Finance.	

- (b) the Committee shall procure funds at short notice to control a serious outbreak of a notifiable disease
- (c) the Committee shall ensure that such funds are released immediately and directly to the authorised officers in charge of the district where the disease outbreak has occurred;
- (d) an authorised officer in charge of the district where there is an outbreak shall submit periodic disease situation reports to the Deputy Director, Research and Specialist Services with copies to the Chairman of the Committee at intervals to be determined by the Chairman of the Committee.

Section 13D

- (1) The Minister may, from time to time by statutory instrument, make, alter and repeal regulations:-
 - (a) to prohibit or regulate the introduction of dogs into Zambia from all or any of the adjacent countries and to authorise the destruction of any dogs unlawfully introduced into Zambia;
 - (b) to prohibit or regulate the removal of dogs from any place to any other place within Zambia;
 - (c) to authorise or require the control isolation, inoculation, muzzling or destruction of any dogs within Zambia or any part thereof and to prescribe the manner in which the carcasses of any dogs so destroyed as aforesaid shall be dealt with or disposed of;
 - (d) to prescribe the manner in which and by whom and to whom notice of the fact shall be given if any dog is suspected of suffering from rabies;
 - (e) to provide for the registration of dogs in any particular area and to prescribe the persons or authorities by whom such registration shall be carried out, the forms to be used, the badges to be issued and the fees to be paid, and any other matters or things he deems it necessary to prescribe in connection with such registration;
 - (f) providing that fees collected under this Act by a rural council shall be paid into the general fund of the rural council;
 - (g) to prescribe penalties for the contravention or attempted contravention of any regulation; such penalties not to exceed two years' imprisonment with or without hard labour or equivalent fine in compliance with Act No.13 of 1994 Part III, sections 6 and 8 and the Schedule section 6 and 8 or both such fine and imprisonment;

Control of Dogs

(2) Any person who shall:-

- (a) fabricate any certificate or badge prescribed by any regulations made under the preceding section with intent that it shall be used as a certificate or badge lawfully issued under such regulations;

Fabrication of certificate or badge

- (b) use or alter any fabricated certificate or badge knowing the same to have been fabricated with intent as aforesaid;
- (c) steal or be found in possession of any certificate or badge issued under such regulations to another person without being able to account satisfactorily for such possession;

shall be guilty of an offense against this Act and shall be liable, on conviction, to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding four years.

Section 13E	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (1) The Minister may, by statutory instrument, prohibit the export of designated animals or designated animal products from Zambia, or any part thereof, in general or to one or more designated countries of destination, unless and until all regulations with regard to their export have been complied with, and may at any time, by like notice, rescind the same (2) The Minister may, by statutory instrument, make regulations for the purpose of regulating and controlling the export of animals and animal products, as prescribed under subsection (1), from Zambia or any thereof and prescribing the fees to be paid in respect of proceeding under such regulations. Section 15 to be amended to, read:

Regulations

- (1) The Minister may make Regulations for the better carrying out of the provisions of the Act and, in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, such Regulations may provide for:-
 - (a) the prevention of the introduction of or the spread of disease in Zambia;
 - (b) the conditions under which animals, animal products and articles may be imported or exported;
 - (c) the prohibition or control of movements of animals, animal products and articles, mode of their transfer; or providing for the compulsory branding or marking of any animals;
 - (d) controlling of the movement of any animal, carcass hide, skin, hoof, hair, wool, semen, embryos, litter dung, fodder and any conveyance

within Zambia and the establishment of animal disease control check points;

- (e) the controlling of:-
 - (i) any disease common to human beings and animals; and
 - (ii) any parasite injurious both to human beings and animals or capable of introducing or spreading amongst human beings or animals any disease referred to in sub paragraph (i);
- (f) the quarantine or isolation of any animal;
- (g) the control, immunisation, compulsory dipping by the owner or farm manager and to regulate the manner in which community participation in control measures shall be conducted;
- (h) the manner in which any infection or contaminated article or anything which can be suspected of being an infected or contaminated article, shall be cared for, treated, disinfected, destroyed or disposed of by the owner thereof or by any owner of premises on which such article is present;
- (i) the manner in which destroyed animals suffering or suspected to have been in contact with diseased animals shall be disposed of;
- (j) the manner in which animals may be transported;
- (k) the cleansing, disinfecting and disinsectising of any truck or vehicle or premises used for the conveyance of animals;
- (l) the cleansing, disinfecting or disinsectising of any building or place where animals infected with disease have been kept;
- (m) the monitoring and regulation of artificial insemination and the distribution and sale of semen, embryos or ova;
- (n) the control of public markets, sales-yards and agricultural showgrounds;
- (o) animal production and health programmes or schemes;
- (p) the dividing of Zambia into Veterinary Districts
- (q) declaration of specified areas;
- (r) declaration of certain areas as disease free zones, buffer zones or stock free zones
- (s) direct that such stock be removed from disease free zones, or buffer zones or stock free zones;
- (t) generally for the prevention and control of disease;
- (u) control of dogs and prevention of rabies

- (v) the regulating of the conduct and discipline of the local veterinary inspector or any authorised person with regard to the respective designated official duties in conformity with the relevant General Orders applicable to the Civil Service.
 - (w) the fees to be paid for anything done or to be done under this Act.
- (2) Any such Regulations may provide that any person who contravenes or fails to comply with such Regulations shall be guilty of an offense against this Act, and may further provide that, unless some other penalty is in such Regulations specifically provided therefore, such person shall be liable to an equivalent fine in compliance with Act No 13 of 1994 part III Section 5 and 8 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two years, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

THE ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

Regulations by the Ministers

15. Regulation 1 to be amended to read Animal Health Regulations. Title
16. Regulations 2 to be amended by the addition of the following:- Interpretation
- "border inspection post" means a veterinary inspection post near the border and the port of entry designated by the Minister by statutory instrument;
- "destroy" in relation to a controlled animal means to kill such animal and bury, incinerate or otherwise dispose of such animal article;
- "game" means all animals that are not cattle, equines, sheep, goats, pigs, poultry, domesticated cat or dog, amphibians, reptiles, fish or birds, but shall not include animals in respect of which the owner is the holder of a game license.
- "official veterinarian" means a civil service veterinarian or a specially appointed veterinarian, authorised by the official veterinary administration of the country of origin.
17. Regulation 3 (1) to be amended to:
- 3 (1) (a) for the purposes of these Regulations, Zambia shall be divided into Veterinary districts as defined in the FIRST SCHEDULE (1) (a) Veterinary districts
- (b) Veterinary districts shall be sub divided into veterinary camp areas in the FIRST SCHEDULE (1) (b) Veterinary camp areas
- (2) (a) No animals shall be moved into or out of a veterinary district without a movement permit issued by a veterinary officer or livestock officer if no veterinary officer is posted to the district, or any officer authorised by the Director.
- (b) The Director may use his discretionary powers to specify the veterinary districts to which sub regulation (2) (a) may apply
- (3) Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with provisions of sub regulation (2) (a) (b) shall be guilty of an offense.
18. Regulation 4 (1) to be amended to read:
- The areas described in the Second Schedule A shall be border posts and those in Second Schedule B shall be quarantine stations into or out of which no animals, shall be moved without a permit issued by an authorised officer Border inspection posts
Quarantine stations
19. Regulation 5 (2) to be amended to read: Importation of

- animals and
specific articles
- (a) No person shall introduce or cause to be introduced into Zambia any article in the Fourth Schedule without a certificate from an official veterinarian of the country of origin from which the article originates stating that there has been no case of foot and mouth disease nor African swine fever in the district of origin during the last six months immediately preceding the issue of such certificate and that, in his opinion, the movement of the article is free from risk of spreading any disease.
- 5.(2)(b)(i) No person shall introduce or cause to be introduced any animal, animal product, carcass, article, or other matter specified in the Third Schedule without a permit issued by the Director or authorised officer. Such permit may be refused at the discretion of the Director without any reason being assigned.
- (ii) a permit referred to in paragraph (i) shall be obtained by an importer before the relevant animals, animal products, carcass, or other matter specified in the Third Schedule are removed from or out of any place in Zambia by means of any conveyance for the purposes of importing into Zambia.
- (iii) shall, where the Director requires that items in paragraph (i) above be detained in quarantine station, only be issued on proof being given that accommodation has been furnished and fees have been paid.
- (3) Any animal, product, carcass, any article specified in the Third Schedule in respect of which a permit has been issued:
- (a) shall only be imported into Zambia through a designated border inspection post
- (b) shall be imported within the period specified in the permit
- (c) shall be detained in the prescribed manner at the relevant border inspection post and shall be made available to the authorised officer for the purposes of the performance of the controlled veterinary action; and
- (d) shall not without the written authority of the authorised officer, or contrary to the conditions stipulated in the permit, be removed from such a place.
4. The Director shall use his discretionary powers to designate any port of entry with respect to the importation of dogs or domesticated cats.
5. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence.
20. Regulation 5A to be added after Regulation 5
- Whenever at any place, whether within or, outside Zambia, there exists, is suspected to exist, any disease which is likely to effect animals, the Minister or authorised officer may make an order to prohibit or regulate the introduction of any animals, animal products, carcass, article or vehicle from such place into Zambia or any portion of Zambia.

21. Regulation 6 A to be added after regulation 6 to read:

Whenever at any place, whether within or outside Zambia, there exists or is suspected to exist, any disease which is likely to effect animals, the Minister may make such order for regulating the quarantine, isolation disinfection, disinsectisation or treatment of animals, carcass, article or vehicles in any part of Zambia.

22. Regulation 8 (1)(3)(4)(5)(6) to be amended to read:

- (1) The Director, or any other officer authorised by the Director, may order that stock which at the date of such order is within or shall subsequently within a period of time specified in such order enter any part of Zambia shall be forthwith inoculated, treated with acaricide, branded or marked or any or all of the above, or
- Inoculation, acaricide application, branding or marking.
- (2) Every order issued under sub-regulation (1) shall-
- (a) if it affects animals in any area within the jurisdiction of a district council, be in writing and signed by the issuing officer and shall be delivered to the district council of the area concerned, and such delivery shall be deemed to be sufficient notice of such order to all owners and persons in control of animals which is within the said area; and
- (b) if it affects animals in any other area of Zambia, be made by notice in writing delivered to the owner or any person in charge of the animals.
- (3) Such inoculation, acaricide treatment or branding or marking or all of the above shall be carried out in accordance with the directions contained in such order or as may be given by a Veterinary Officer.
- (4) In pursuance of any order made under this regulation, a Veterinary Officer may inoculate or cause to be inoculated, may treat or cause to be treated with acaricide and may brand or mark or cause to be branded or marked any animal.
- (5) If a Veterinary Officer is of opinion that any inoculation, acaricide treatment or branding or marking has not been carried out in a satisfactory manner, he may require either or any of the above operations to be repeated until he is satisfied therewith.
- (6) If the owner of any animal to which an order made under the provisions of sub-regulation (1) relates, fails to inoculate, treat with acaricide, brand or mark or any of the above in accordance with the provisions of this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offense.

23. Regulation 9 (1) to be amended to read:

Any permit relating to the movement of any animals, carcass or article and issued pursuant to the provisions of the Act or any regulation or order made there under shall be in writing and signed by the issuing officer as prescribed in regulation 3 (2) (a) after personally and physically examining the animals, carcass or article.

- (i) The permit shall contain:
 - (a) the full names, address and identification of the person to whom such permit is issued.
 - (b) the number, description and in case of movement of cattle individual identification marks of each individual animal, carcass or article which may be moved by virtue of such permit;
 - (c) the dates between which such permit shall be valid:
 - (d) the mode of transportation and the registration number of the conveyance where applicable;
 - (e) the route or routes along which items in (b) may be moved; and the official date stamp of the issuing officer;

24. Regulation 9(3)(c) to be amended to read:

District Executive Secretary and/or Town Clerk/Executive Officer

25. Regulation 10(1) to be amended to read:

No person shall manufacture, introduce or sell or expose for sale in Zambia any virus, vaccine, serum or analogous product, used or to be used for the diagnosis or treatment of disease of animals except under and in accordance with the provisions of a permit in writing issued by the Director.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Control of Dogs (Inoculation) Regulations, and shall apply to the areas set forth in the First Schedule. Title and application

2. In these Regulations, unless the context requires:- Interpretation

"dog" means any animal of the canine species which is over the apparent age of three months;

"inoculation" means inoculation with a rabies vaccine approved by the Director, and "re-inoculation", "inoculated" and "re-inoculated" shall be construed accordingly;

"officer" includes any Registering Authority, Administrative Officer, Veterinary Officer, police officer, officer of the Department of Wildlife and National Parks, Livestock Officer and Livestock Assistant;

"valid certificate of inoculation" means a certificate issued by an officer or veterinary surgeon and so endorsed by the said officer or veterinary surgeon as to indicate that the dog has been inoculated in accordance with the provisions of regulation 4.

3. (1) The veterinary officer may notify: Notification of inoculation centres etc.
 - (a) the places;
 - (b) the dates; and
 - (c) the times;
at or upon or within which inoculation of dogs shall take place in any area to which these Regulations apply or in any part of such area.

- (2) Notification under the provisions of this regulation shall be given, at least fourteen days before inoculation is to take place, by publication in the Gazette

and by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area concerned, and in any other manner which the Director may think fit.
